






# Animal Matching Game

1. Print out the Animal Fur and Skin Patterns sheets
2. If you want them sturdier, you could glue them to thin cardboard or cardstock. If you have cardstock, you can print them on that.
3. Cut out each animal set.
4. Cut each animal set in half so that the animal and the fur or skin pattern picture are on separate cards or are separate pieces.
5. Using them: **Option 1:** Use them as flashcards to help children identify animals.  
Or **Option 2:** Create a memory style game by turning the cards picture side down, and then asking children to match the animal with the correct fur or skin pattern.  
Or **Option 3:** Create your own game.
