


- 1. Print out puzzle sheet on paper or cardstock.
  - 2. Color the picture.
- 3. If you print the picture out on regular printer paper, you may want to glue the colored in picture to some think cardboard. A cardboard box would work; the thin cardboard of a cereal box should be thick enough to strengthen the picture.
- 4. After everything has dried, carefully cut apart the pieces of the puzzle using the lines through the picture.
  - 5. Trim edges to get rid of stray pieces of paper or cardboard.
    - 6. Play with puzzle.
